THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, (Chapter 309).

UNDER SECTION 8 OF THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH 1 OF ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Customs Duties (Amendment) Order, 1962.

2. Part I of the First Schedule to the Customs Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by —

- (a) the substitution of the rates of import duty set forth in the third column against the articles numbered and described in the first and second columns of the First Schedule to this Order for the rates of import duty set against the corresponding articles numbered and described in the said Part I;
- (b) the deletion therefrom of the items set forth in the first, second third and fourth columns of the Second Schedule to this Order;
- (c) the insertion of the items set forth in the first, second, third and fourth columns of the Third Schedule to this Order;
- (d) the substitution for the proviso immediately before the table of Export Duties of the following:---

"Provided further that shirts for men and boys and for women and girls, other than knitted or made of knitted fabrics, of a value not exceeding \$30.00 per doz. C.I.F. (British West Indian Currency) shall be subjected to an additional duty under the preferential tariff of \$12.00 per doz., and under the general tariff of \$12.00 per doz";

(e) the re-numbering of items 5 and 6 in the said table of Export Duties as items 7 and 8, respectively, and the insertion after item 4 in such table of the following new items:—

3. Part IV of the First Schedule to the Customs Ordinance as amended from time to time is hereby further amended by the insertion of the words "(Other than greenheart timber and lumber)" after the word "lumber" in item 4.
