

BRITISH GUIANA

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 5).

UNDER SECTION 40 OF THE INTERPRETATION ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Delegation of Powers (No. 2) Order, 1964.

2. The Minister responsible for finance is hereby deputed to exercise on behalf of the Governor the power specified in the first column of the schedule to this Order conferred on the Governor by the Ordinance mentioned in the second column of the said schedule, subject, however, to the following conditions and qualifications —

- (a) that the delegation of the power effected by this Order shall remain in force only until varied or revoked by the Governor; and
- (b) that the exercise of the power delegated by this Order shall be subject to any directions, either general or particular, which the Governor may from time to time give in that respect.

Power Delegated

To authorise the Comptroller of Customs and Excise to issue a licence to any person in respect of the sale of intoxicating liquor at the airport at Atkinson Field.
