## ORDER

## MADE UNDER

## THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 1964.

WHEREAS I am satisfied that the broadcasting of any of the matters specified in the Schedule to this Order might be prejudicial to public safety and order :

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the power conferred on me by paragraph (2) of regulation 17 of the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1964, as amended from time to time, and of all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I do hereby order and direct as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Control of Broadcasts) Order, 1964.

2. It shall be unlawful for any person to broadcast, or to cause to be broadcast or to permit any other person to broadcast through any wireless transmitting apparatus any of the matters specified in the Schedule hereto.

3. The Governor may by writing under his hand appoint a person to be a Comptroller of Broadcast Materials for the purposes of this Order.

4. (1) After the appointment of a Comptroller of Broadcast Materials under the preceding paragraph it shall be unlawful for any person to broadcast or to cause to be broadcast or to permit any other person to broadcast through any wireless apparatus any communication or other matter whatsoever unless such communication or other matter has been approved for broadcasting by the Comptroller of Broadcast Materials as not containing any of the matters specified in the Schedule hereto:

Provided that the Comptroller may give his approval generally in respect of any specified classes of communications or other matters.

(2) Any approval given by the Comptroller of Broadcast Materials, whether given generally or in relation to a specific communication or matter, may be at any time withdrawn.

## SCHEDULE

1. Any matter tending to promote or excite feelings of enmity, hostility or ill-will between persons of different communities, races, places of origin, religious or political opinions in the Colony, or between any group of persons, however constituted, and any other group of persons in the Colony.

2. The advocacy or encouragement or approbation of disobedience or resistance to or disregard of any of the laws of the Colony.

3. The advocacy or encouragement or approbation of disobedience to any authority lawfully constituted.

4. Any matter tending to promote feelings of hostility or ill-will towards members of Her Majesty's Forces in the Colony.
