# THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 1964 (No. 8 of 1964)

# UNDER REGULATION 42 OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULA-TIONS, 1964, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING ME IN THAT BEHALF, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:--

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Curfew) (No. 2) Order, 1964, and shall come into force on the 10th day of July, 1964.

2. No person shall between the hours of 6.30 p.m. of any day and 5.30 a.m. of the following day be out of doors in the area of the Colony specified in the Schedule hereto except under the authority of a written permit granted by the Police Officer commanding "C" Division or the Officer Commanding "B" Company, 1st Battalion, The Queen's Own Buffs.

### SCHEDULE

#### CURFEW AREA

The portion of Plantations Annandale, La Reconnaisance, Buxton, Friendship, Vigilance, Bladen Hall and Strathspey, situated on the East Coast of Demerara, and bounded as follows —

On the North — by the Atlantic Ocean.

On the South — by the northern edge of a trench about 3,100 feet south of the centre line of the East Coast Railway, measured along the western boundary of the area; by the western edge of the trench on the eastern side of the dam between Plantations Buxton and Friendship, from a point about 1,800 feet south of the centre line of the East Coast Railway to a point about 2,300 feet south of the centre line of the East Coast Railway, by the northern edge of a trench about 2,300 feet south of the centre line of the East Coast Railway, measured along the dam between Buxton and Friendship; by the western edge of the trench on the eastern side of the dam between Plantations Bladen Hall and Strathspey from a point about 1,000 feet south of the centre line of the East Coast Railway to a point about 1,300 feet north of the centre line of the East Coast Railway; by the northern edge of a canal about 1,300 feet north of the centre line of the East Coast Railway, measured along the dam between Plantations Bladen Hall and Strathspey.

- On the East by the western edge of the Drainage Canal between Plantations Strathspey and Coldingen, which runs diagonally across Plantations Strathspey, Bladen Hall and Vigilance, north of the public road and has its outfall near the boundary between Plantations Friendship and Vigilance.
- On the West by the western edge of the trench on the eastern side of the dam between Plantations Lusignan and Annandale, and its prolongation northward.
