ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS 1964

UNDER PARAGRAPH (6) OF REGULATION 49 A OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS 1964, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING ME IN THAT BEHALF, I DO HEREBY ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Amnesty for Illegal Possession of Arms) Order, 1964.

2. The provisions of paragraph (6) of regulation 49 A of the Emergency Powers Regulations 1964 (relating to the exemption in certain circumstances from certain penalties) shall apply to any person who, between the 22nd day of July, 1964 and the 27th day of July 1964, both days inclusive, surrenders any firearm, ammunition or explosive to any member of the Police Force or of Her Majesty's Forces or to any embodied member of the British Guiana Volunteer Force.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order but is intended to indicate its general purport)

The effect of this Order is that any person who is unlawfully in possession of any firearms, ammunition or explosives is exempted from any penalty for such unlawful possession if he surrenders the firearm, ammunition or explosives to a member of the Police Force or to a member of Her Majesty's Forces or to an embodied member of the British Guiana Volunteer Force between the 22nd day of July 1964, and the 27th day of July 1964.
