THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 1963

UNDER REGULATION 47 OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS REGULATIONS, 1963, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:-

1. This Order may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Firearms Dealers) Order, 1963.

2. For the purposes of this Order the expressions "ammunition" "firearm" and "firearms dealers" have the same meanings as in the Firearms Ordinance, Cap. 345, except that firearm shall not include an airgun, an air rifle or air pistol.

3.(1) Every firearms dealer who at any time has in his possession, custody or control any firearms, ammunition or explosive substances shall whenever and as from time to time demanded by or on behalf of the Commissioner of Police remove the said firearms, ammunition or explosive substances to such place as may be directed by the Commissioner of Police:

Provided that the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply to any firearms or ammunition which a firearms dealer is personally licensed to hold under the provisions of section 18 of the Firearms Ordinance, Cap. 345.

(2) Every firearms dealer shall, within 48 hours of receiving into his possession, custody or control any firearms, ammunition or explosive substances, make out and supply to the nearest Police Station a full and complete inventory of all firearms, ammunition or explosive substances so received by him.

4.(1) No firearms dealer shall sell or otherwise deal in any firearms, ammunition or explosive substances whether or not they have been removed as aforesaid except with the permission of the Commissioner of Police.

(2) The provisions of the immediately preceding paragraph shall be in addition to the provisions of section 18 of the Firearms Ordinance, Cap. 345.

5. This Order shall apply throughout British Guiana.
