MADE UNDER

THE ANIMALS DISEASES ORDINANCE

(Chapter 258)

UNDER SECTIONS 2 AND 13 OF THE ANIMALS DISEASES ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF THE FOLLOWING ORDER HAS BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR'S DEPUTY:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Poultry and Poultry Eggs (Conditions of Importation) Order, 1965.
 - In this Order
 - "poultry" means any live bird of the following species, that is to say, any domestic fowl, turkey, goose, duck, guinea fowl, pheasant or pigeon.
 - 3. For the purposes of this Order
 - (a) poultry shall be included in the definition of the expression "animal" in section 2 of the Animals Diseases Ordinance*;
 - (b) Newcastle Disease, fowl pest, fowl typhoid and pullorum disease are hereby declared to be diseases within the meaning of the Animals Diseases Ordinance*.
- 4. (1) Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this article, no poultry or poultry eggs shall be imported into British Guiana from any country other than those countries specified in the schedule to this Order.
- (2) Poultry or poultry eggs imported from any of the countries specified in the schedule to this Order shall be accompanied by a certificate of health signed by the proper authority in the country of origin to the effect that the poultry or noultry eggs emanated from flocks free from Newcastle Disease, fowl pest, fowl typhoid and pullorum disease.
- 5. No person shall import into British Guiana any container or receptacle used for storing or conveying poultry eggs or poultry feed unless the container or receptacle is new and clean.
- 6. The Animals Diseases (Conditions of Importation of Poultry) Order, 1958**, and all amendments thereto are hereby revoked.
