

BRITISH GUIANA

ORDER

MADE UNDER

THE TRADE ORDINANCE, 1958

(No. 34 of 1958).

UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE TRADE ORDINANCE, 1958, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR'S DEPUTY AS FOLLOWS:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Trade (Control of Imports and Exports) Order, 1965, and shall be construed and read as one with the Trade (Control of Import and Export) Order, 1963, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Order, and any Order amending the same.

2. The following article shall be inserted as article 10 of the Principal Order —

“10. This Order shall not apply to —

(a) the consulate in British Guiana of a foreign country;

(b) any consular officer or consular employee of such a consulate :

Provided that —

- (i) he is a citizen of the said foreign country;
- (ii) he is a permanent employee of the Government of that country and is not engaged in any private occupation for gain within British Guiana;
- (iii) his appointment as a consular officer or consular employee of the consulate has been duly notified to the Government of British Guiana; and
- (iv) any goods imported by him shall be for his personal use or the personal use of members of his family forming part of his household;
- (c) the mission in British Guiana of any country in the Commonwealth or of the Republic of Ireland;
- (d) the official representative in British Guiana or any country in the Commonwealth or of the Republic of Ireland, or a member of his official staff, for his personal use or the personal use of members of his family forming part of his household;

Provided that —

- (i) he is a citizen of any such country in the Commonwealth or of the Republic of Ireland;

- (ii) he is a permanent employee of the Government of any such country in the Commonwealth or of the Republic of Ireland and is not engaged in any private occupation for gain within British Guiana;
- (iii) his appointment as such representative or as a member of the official staff of such representative has been duly notified to the Government of British Guiana; and
- (iv) any goods imported by him shall be for his personal use or the personal use of members of his family forming part of his household."
