BAKERIES (HOURS OF WORK).

ORDER IN COUNCIL

made under section 4.

O. in C. 15 of 1947. 28th March,

CERTAIN PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

- 1. This order may be cited as the Bakeries (Hours of Work) (Certain Public Holidays) Order.
- 2. Anything contained in section 3 of the Bakeries (Hours of Work) Ordinance to the contrary notwithstanding, any person may in any year be employed in a bakery in the manufacture of bread and flour confectionery or in any other work incidental thereto—
 - (a) between the hour of seven in the evening of the Wednesday immediately preceding Good Friday and the hour of five in the morning of the Thursday following that Wednesday;
 - (b) between the hour of seven in the evening of the 23rd day of December and the hour of five in the morning of the succeeding day; and
 - (c) between the hour of seven in the evening of the 30th day of December and the hour of five in the morning of the succeeding day;

for the purpose of providing supplies for Good Friday, Christmas day and the first week-day of January, respectively.

3. A person employed in accordance with paragraph 2 of this order on any date specified therein shall not be employed on the holiday following that date, save that where a person is so employed on the Wednesday preceding Good Friday he may be employed from the hour of seven in the evening on Good Friday.
