

CHAPTER 146.

VACCINATION.

Fees.

ORDER IN COUNCIL

made under sections 4 (3) and 5 (3) on the 17th October, 1935.

WHEREAS it is provided by section 4 subsection (3) of the Vaccination Ordinance that every public vaccinator shall receive such fees for the performance of vaccination in his district, and of other duties connected therewith as the Governor in Council may direct, and that such fees shall be payable from such moneys as may be provided by the Legislative Council for purposes of vaccination:

And whereas it is provided by section 5 subsection (3) of the said Ordinance that every vaccination officer shall receive such fees for the performance of duties assigned to him as the Governor in Council may direct, and such fees shall be payable from such moneys as may be provided by the Legislative Council for purposes of vaccinations:

And whereas it is deemed necessary to alter the fees now paid for the said duties:

Now, therefore, the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order and direct that from and after the 1st May, 1935, the following fees shall be payable—

To public vaccinators—

For each successful vaccination...	08 cents.
For each case found insusceptible to successful vaccination, after three vaccinations ...	08 cents.
For each vaccination, where in the opinion of the Director of Medical Services verification is impossible on account of the circumstances under which the vaccination is performed ...	08 cents.

Provided that where a public vaccinator is also a Government medical officer, he shall not be entitled to fees for vaccinations, if appointed a Government medical officer after the 17th June, 1929, unless the Governor, having regard to all the circumstances shall so direct.

To vaccination officers—

For each vaccination ...	04 cents.

issued on the 14th April, 1903, by the Director of Medical Services with the sanction of the Governor under section 4 of Ordinance No. 3 of 1894, which was incorporated with the Public Health Ordinance, 1875 (since repealed and replaced by the present chapter 145).

1. They shall enter in a book to be provided for that purpose the following particulars of all children born in the district for which they have been appointed, viz.—

Vaccination district.

Name of child.

Date of birth.

Sex.

Name of parent or guardian.

Residence.

Date taken to vaccination officer to be vaccinated.

If successful or unsuccessful.

If prosecuted, date and result.

If granted a certificate on Forms 3 or 4 of Vaccination Ordinance, state date.

If dead, state date.

If left district, state date and where removed to.

Remarks.

2. A copy of the above shall be forwarded to the Director of Medical Services not later than the 5th of each month.

3. They shall see that all children born in their district are taken to the public vaccinator to be vaccinated within six months of birth, and in case of refusal of parent or guardian to have child vaccinated they shall summon the parent or guardian under section 16 of the Vaccination Ordinance.

4. They shall endeavour to arrange that all children vaccinated are taken to the public vaccinator on the 8th day after vaccination for the purpose of certifying whether the vaccination has been successful or not.

5. They shall personally attend at the vaccination stations for the district to which they have been appointed on the days and hours prescribed.

6. They shall, subject to the control of the Director of Medical Services, act under the direction of the Public Vaccinator of their district.
