ORDERS IN COUNCIL

RULES OF COURT

Rules of Court, 22nd Nov., 1923.

made by the Judges and approved by the Governor and Court of Policy on the 22nd November, 1923.

Prescribed officer.

1. The Registrar for the time being shall be the prescribed officer of the court in the Colony under section 3, subsection (1) of the Maintenance Orders (Facilities for Enforcement) Ordinance, hereafter in these rules referred to as the Ordinance.

Registration of maintenance orders.

- 2. (1) All orders, copies of which are transmitted for their enforcement to the Governor under the Ordinance and by him sent to the court, shall be entered in a register to be kept for that purpose, and the copies so transmitted shall be filed in the registry.
- (2) The register aforesaid shall be open to inspection upon payment of a search fee of two shillings.
- (3) Office copies of orders so registered shall be supplied upon payment of the proper fees.
- (4) Any order sent to the Governor under the Ordinance for enforcement in England or Ireland, or in any of Her Majesty's dominions and protectorates to which the Ordinance extends, shall be entered in the said register and a note made thereof in the court minutes of the suit in which that order occurs.
- (5) The prescribed officer may give such further departmental directions as to the filing, registration, and transmission of any order in these rules mentioned as he shall think proper.

Short title.

3. These rules may be cited as Rules of the Supreme Court (Maintenance Orders Registration).
