ORDERS

made by the Governor in Council under section 23.

ORDER

made on the 16th March, 1934.

WHEREAS it is enacted by paragraphs (a) and (b) of subsection (1) of section 22 of the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance that a contributor shall contribute to the fund established under the Ordinance at the annual rate of five *per cent.* of the maximum salary of his office and may elect to make an additional annual contribution of two and a half *per centum* of the maximum salary of his office;

AND WHEREAS it is enacted by section 23 of the said Ordinance that, notwithstanding the afore-mentioned enactment where the salary of an office is on an incremental scale the Governor in Council may, by order, fix an intermediate amount in such scale as a maximum salary for the purpose of contributions to the said fund provided that any order so made shall cease to have effect when an officer's salary shall have attained the amount so fixed;

AND WHEREAS it is expedient to fix intermediate amounts in the scale of salary of Class III Clerks of the Civil Service of this Colony as maximum salaries for the purpose of contributions to the said fund:

Now, therefore, the Governor, in exercise of the powers by the above recited enactment in him vested, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby order:—

I. As and from the 1st January, 1934, the intermediate amounts six hundred and forty-eight dollars and nine hundred dollars, in the scale of salary of Class III Clerks

of the Civil Service of the Colony, shall be maximum salaries for the purpose of contributions to the fund established under the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance.

II. This Order may be cited as the Widows and Orphans Pension Order.

ORDER

made on the 23rd March, 1945.

1. This order may be cited as the Widows and Orphans Pension (Rates of Contribution) Order, 1945.

2. Subject to the provision contained in the proviso to section 23 of the Ordinance, the amounts shown in the second column of the schedule hereto shall, for the purposes of the Ordinance, be deemed to be the maximum salaries of the offices set out in the first column of the said schedule.

3. This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st January, 1945.

ORDER

made on the 14th November, 1949.

1. This order may be cited as the Widows and Orphans Pension (Rates of Contribution) Order, 1949.

2. Subject to the provisions contained in the proviso to section 23 of the Ordinance, the amounts shown in the second column of the schedule hereto shall, for the purposes of the

Ordinance, be deemed to be the maximum salaries of the officers on the scales set out in the first column of the said schedule.

3. This order shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st November, 1949.

REGULATIONS

made by the Directors under section 53 on the 20th April, 1926, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 7th May, 1926, and amended by regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 18th July, 1951.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Widows and Orphans Fund (Directors Election) Regulations. Short title.

2. (1) The Chairman of the Directors of the Widows and Orphans Fund shall, not later than the 14th May in each year cause a notice to be published in the Gazette and one newspaper fixing a day and hour for the election of two members of the Legislative Council to be Directors of the said Fund. Annual election by contributors of two members of Legislative Council as Directors.

(2) The election shall be not less than six and not more than ten days after the day on which such notice is first published, and shall be held at such convenient place in Georgetown as the Chairman may appoint.

(3) Every contributor registered in accordance with the provisions of the Widows and Orphans Pension Ordinance shall be entitled to vote at any such election.

(4) The two members of the Legislative Council having the greatest number of votes, shall be deemed to be elected, provided that not less than twenty-five *per cent.* of the registered contributors vote at the election. 18th July, 1951.

Mode of voting at election.

3. (1) Contributors shall record their votes in writing.

(2) Contributors who attend the place of election may record their votes between the hours of 9 to 11 a.m. and 1 to 3 p.m. in a book to be kept by the secretary for that purpose.

(3) A contributor who does not attend at the place of election may vote according to the form in the schedule to these regulations signed by him, addressed to the secretary, and transmitted so as to be delivered at the place of election before 3 o'clock on the afternoon of the day on which the election is held.

Declaration and publication of result of voting.

4. (1) The Chairman shall cause the votes to be counted and the names of the persons elected to be declared at the conclusion of the counting.

(2) He shall cause a notice to be published in the Gazette stating the names of the persons elected.
