

## CHAPTER 318.

## BITTERS AND CORDIALS.

## Allowed Manufacturing Losses.

## ORDER IN COUNCIL

*made under section 18 on the 2nd January, 1945,*

1. This order may be cited as the Bitters and Cordials (Allowed Manufacturing Losses) Order.

2. In this order—

“bay rum” and “lime rum” mean bay rum or lime rum, respectively, <sup>*which does not exceed in strength 103° W - etc.*</sup> ~~which is not over proof and not potable~~ when prepared for use or consumption in the Colony, but which may be both over proof and potable when prepared for export;

“compound” means any bitters, or cordials, or sweets, or other thing in the manufacture whereof spirits whether distilled or not distilled, are combined with any other ingredient;

“medical compounds” means compounds passed by the Comptroller of Customs as medicinal preparations made from or containing spirits;

“other toilet preparations” means toilet preparations which are deemed by the Comptroller of Customs to be of a similar nature to bay rum and lime rum, and for similar use;

“perfumed spirits” means perfumed spirits other than bay rum and lime rum of a strength over proof and passed as perfumed spirits by the Comptroller of Customs.

3. The percentage allowed for loss of spirits in the process of manufacture of the compounds set out in the first column of the schedule hereto shall be those set out in the second column of the said schedule.

## SCHEDULE.

Compounds.	Percentage allowed for loss of spirits in process of manufacture.
(1) Manufacture of bay rum, lime rum, other toilet preparations or perfumed spirits—	
(a) for use or consumption in the Colony ... ..	4 per centum.
(b) for export ... ..	6 per centum.
(2) Manufacture of medicinal compounds—	
(a) if mascerated ... ..	12 per centum.
(b) if not mascerated ... ..	6 per centum.
(3) Manufacture of any other compound ... ..	12 per centum.
(4) Fortifying of sweets ... ..	6 per centum.
