## **ORDER**

## THE PRESIDENT'S COLLEGE ACT 1990

(No. 11 of 1990)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON THE MINISTER BY SECTION 22 OF THE PRESIDENT'S COLLEGE ACT 1990 I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING ORDER:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Sixth Form Secondary Schools (Board of Governors) Order 1993 and shall come into operation on 1st September, 1993.

Citation and commencement:

2. (1) The provisions of the Act, other than sections 1, 2, 3 (1). 10, 13 and 22 shall mutatis mutandis apply in relation to each of the educational institutions mentioned in paragraph (3) and for that purpose shall be read and construed with any necessary modifications and, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing subject, in particular for the purposes of such application to the modification in paragraph (4).

Application of certain provisions of the Act.

(2) Each of the educational institutions mentioned in paragraph (3) shall be administered and maintained by a Board of Governors which shall be a body corporate.

- (3) The educational institutions referred to in the preceding paragraphs are the Sixth Form Secondary Schools namely
  - (a) Queen's College;
  - (b) Bishops' High School;
  - (c) St. Stanislaus College;
  - (d) St Rose's High School;
  - (e) New Amsterdam Secondary School;
  - (f) Anna Regina Secondary School;
- (4) The following is the modification referred to in paragraph (1) —

for section 13 the following section shall be substituted —

"Vesting of assets in Board of Governors:

13. The assets (whether movable or immovable property, including rights and interests) belonging to the State in relation to each of the schools to which this Order applies are hereby vested in the Board of Governors of that school and the Registrar of Deeds shall accordingly make the necessary annotations in his record in respect of the aforesaid immovable property."
