

ORDINANCE No. 13 OF 1910.

A.D. 1910. AN ORDINANCE to amend the Wine, etc., Licences Ordinance, 1868, with respect to the granting of permits for the removal of Rum.

[10th September, 1910.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Court of Policy thereof, as follows:—

Schedule.

1.—(1) It shall be lawful for the Excise Board in such cases and upon such conditions as they may see fit, to authorize the holder of any retail spirit shop licence to give permission, in the form contained in the Schedule to this Ordinance, for the removal of rum sold by him exceeding in quantity one quart: Provided that nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorize the removal of rum from one retail spirit shop to another.

(2) Any holder of a retail spirit shop licence so authorized who sells or delivers under such permission any larger or smaller quantity of rum than that named in such permission shall be guilty of an offence and on conviction thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five hundred dollars.
