

ORDINANCE No. 15 OF 1912.

AN ORDINANCE to amend the Passengers Ordinance, A.D. 1912.
1864.

[11th January, 1913.]

BE it enacted by the Governor of British Guiana, with the advice and consent of the Court of Policy thereof, as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in section six of the Passengers Ordinance, 1864⁽¹⁾, any passenger ship on a voyage between this Colony and any place not exceeding twelve miles outside the limits of the Colony may on such voyage carry the number of passengers which it might carry if it were a vessel employed in a coasting voyage, under any regulations made under the Shipping Casualties Prevention Ordinance, 1895⁽²⁾, and if there are on board any such ship at or after the time of clearance a greater number of persons than the number aforesaid the master of such ship shall, on being convicted thereof be liable to a penalty of not less than twenty-four dollars and not exceeding ninety-six dollars for each person in excess of such number aforesaid.

Number of passengers to be carried on voyage outside limits of Colony.

2. This Ordinance may be cited as the Passengers Ordinance, 1864, Amendment Ordinance, 1912, and shall be read as one with the Passengers Ordinance, 1864.
