CHAPTER 52.

CIVIL LIST.

[No. XXXIII of 1928.]

[12th January, 1928.]

- Short title. 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Civil List Ordinance.
- Grant of civil list. 2. There shall be payable to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, in each and every year beginning on the first day of January, ¹⁹²⁹ nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, the sum of twenty-eight thousand one hundred and eighty-five pounds, for defraying the expenses of the services and for the purposes mentioned in the schedule hereto.
- Schedule. Dec-27 Ord. 1928
- Appropriation of sum voted. Schedule. 3. Out of the sum aforesaid there shall be paid the several amounts set forth in the schedule hereto to the persons holding the offices therein specified.
- Security for and mode of payment of sums for Civil List. 4. The sum aforesaid of twenty-eight thousand one hundred and eighty-five pounds is hereby charged upon and made payable from and out of the revenues of the colony, with preference over and above all other payments whatsoever which have heretofore been, or which may hereafter be, charged or become chargeable to, or payable from or out of, those revenues; and the sum aforesaid shall grow due and become payable to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, monthly on the last day of each month in the year by even and equal portions, and the Colonial Treasurer may from time to time, upon the warrant of the Governor, pay the sum out of the moneys arisen or to arise from and out of those revenues without any further or other order or formality.
- Colonial revenues payable to use of colony during continuance of Ordinance. 5. The entire revenues of the colony, of whatever nature or description they may be and howsoever arising, which of right or by custom would hitherto, in the absence of any provision for a Civil List, have been payable to his Majesty's predecessors for the uses of the colony, and which

have accrued or shall hereafter accrue to His Majesty, his heirs and successors, shall during the continuance of this Ordinance and no longer be payable to the use of the colony.
