## CHAPTER 136.

## HOBABOE CREEK (DIVERSION).

[No. XVII of 1902.]

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Hobaboe Creek (Diversion) Ordinance.

Demerara Company authorised to construct canal. 2. The Demerara Company, Limited, is hereby empowered to dig, construct, maintain, and use a canal leading from the Hobaboe creek into the Demerara river, and between the respective side lines of plantations Potosi and Vive la Force, and to divert the flow of the water of the Hobaboe creek into that canal and through its whole length.

Company authorised to place dams. 3. The Company is hereby further empowered to place across the Hobaboe creek in its then disused channel between De Jonge Rachael, part of plantation Wales on the north, and Patientia, part of plantation Vriesland on the south, of the said creek, two dams for the purpose of connecting the navigation canals of the two last mentioned plantations.

Width and depth of canal and raising of dams.

4. The canal shall be of a uniform width of twenty feet at the top, and a uniform depth of four feet, the slopes varying according to the nature of the soil, and the dams on either side of the canal shall be raised to the level of the back dams of plantations Vive la Force and Potosi.

Company to construct bridge across canal: 5. The Company shall further, at its own expense, construct across the canal on the line of the public road, and maintain so long as the existing bridge over the Hobaboe creek continues to be maintained as a bridge at the expense of the colony, a carriage bridge in accordance with the provisions of sections thirty-six and thirty-eight of the Roads Ordinance, (1) having a span across the canal approved by the Director of Public Works:

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Provided that when the existing bridge ceases to exist, the work of making a permanent roadway in place thereof,

together with the construction of any culvert found necessarv there, shall be performed by the Company to the satisfaction of the Director of Public Works.

6. The Company shall at their own expense place at the Company waterside of the canal a sluice koker with concrete sides shiice koker. and wings and a greenheart lifting door of a width of fifteen feet, and shall thereafter at all times at the like expense maintain the koker in good and sufficient repair. koker shall be constructed and maintained to the satisfaction of the polder authority.

7. The polder authority, as constituted by the Polder Control and Ordinance, shall have the general supervision and control of the canal and sluice, but the opening and shutting of the sluice. sluice shall be provided for by the Company, its successors Chapter 174. or assigns, who shall also bear and pay all the expenses of the construction and upkeep of the canal.

8. If at any time hereafter the bed of the Hobaboe creek, Company between the present stop-off in the canal known as another canal the southern boundary canal and the new canal, is not avail- in certain able for relief purposes, and the polder authority would be therefore, in the opinion of that authority, but for the provisions of this section compelled to continue and complete the digging of the southern boundary canal, the Company shall at its own expense, dig, construct, and maintain a canal of the same dimensions as the canal by section two of this Ordinance authorised to be constructed, from the stop-off in the southern boundary canal to the canal by section two of this Ordinance authorised to be constructed. the course of the canal in this section provided for to be determined by the Company. If the canal provided for in this section is constructed, it shall be subject to the same control, upkeep, and maintenance as is provided for in section seven of this Ordinance in regard to the canal by section three of this Ordinance authorised to be constructed.

9. Any existing rights of plantation Wales to a supply Rights of of water conserved in the western boundary canals of the plantation water. polder shall cease from the commencement of this Ordinance:

Provided that if in the future, either from the placing of Proviso. a stop-off in the Bonesica creek or from any other cause, water is conserved at a higher level than it now is in times of drought, then, in that case, those rights shall revive.

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
