1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Industrial Training Ordinance. Short title.

2. In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires,— Interpreta-  
tion.  
“the Board” means the board of industrial training established under this Ordinance ;

“master” means any master tradesman whom the Board has licensed to receive apprentices under this Ordinance, and includes any partnership, firm or company ;

“apprentice” means any person apprenticed under this Ordinance.

3. (1) There shall be appointed from time to time by the Governor fit persons not exceeding ten to be a board of industrial training, three of whom shall be skilled in and actually engaged in one or more of the trades to which boys may be apprenticed under this Ordinance. Appointment  
of Board.

(2) Every appointment shall be for a term of three years, but for any reasonable cause may be revoked by the Governor before the expiration of that term. During the temporary absence of any member of the Board, the Governor may appoint some fit person to act in his stead.

(3) No business shall be transacted at any meeting of the Board unless at least five of its members be present.

(4) The Governor shall from time to time appoint one of the members to be chairman of the Board.

Incorporation  
of Board.

4. The Board shall be a body corporate by the name of The Board of Industrial Training, and may sue and be sued by that name.

Duties of  
Board.

5. The duties of the Board shall be—

(a) to licence and keep a register of masters whom it considers suitable to receive apprentices ;

(b) to issue certificates of efficiency to those artisans who are in its opinion qualified to be engaged in any trade or craft to which this Ordinance applies and to keep a register of the artisans ;

(c) to fix the period of apprenticeship for the different trades to which this Ordinance applies ;

(d) to procure the training by competent masters, and keep a register, of apprentices, to any trade or craft to which this Ordinance applies ;

(e) to cause to be examined, and if satisfied with their skill, to issue certificates to apprentices on the completion of their term of service ;

(f) to cancel licences and certificates issued under this Ordinance, when in its opinion it is necessary so to do ;

(g) to settle disputes arising between masters and apprentices, and to transfer apprentices when desirable ;

(h) to arrange and direct the technical education of apprentices ;

(i) to appoint and pay the masters and examiners whom it considers necessary.

Fee for  
certificate of  
efficiency.

6. The Board may demand and receive any sum not exceeding two dollars for every licence and certificate of efficiency issued under this Ordinance, and the money so received shall be part of the funds of the Board.

7. No one who is not a master licensed under this Ordinance shall take an apprentice to any trade or craft to which this Ordinance applies, and anyone not so licensed who takes or receives an apprentice shall on summary conviction thereof be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.

Unlicensed person not to take apprentice.

8. (1) The Board may make regulations as to the terms and conditions to be observed by masters and apprentices and for the forms of apprenticeship, indentures, and bonds to be used under this Ordinance, and may annex to the breach of any of the regulations, or to the breach of any term or condition in any apprenticeship, indenture, or bond, a penalty not exceeding fifty dollars.

Regulations as to terms and conditions of apprenticeship.

(2) None of the regulations shall take effect until it has been confirmed by the Governor in Council, who may confirm, disallow, or alter it as he thinks proper.

9. (1) The funds of the Board shall be applied in the first place to the remuneration of the secretary and servants of the Board, and in the next place to the discharge of all liabilities incurred by the Board in the performance of its duties.

Application of funds of Board.

(2) The Board shall cause a true and correct account to be kept of all moneys received and expended by it and shall when required so to do submit the account to be audited by the Director of Audit.

10. The Board may from time to time make any regulations necessary for the proper discharge of its duties under this Ordinance.

Regulations.

11. Any offence created or penalty imposed by this Ordinance, or by any regulation made hereunder, may be prosecuted or recovered under the Summary Jurisdiction Ordinances.

Procedure.

12. (1) This Ordinance shall apply to the trades and crafts mentioned in the schedule hereto, and to any other trades and crafts which the Governor in Council from time to time orders to be added to the schedule.

Trades to which Ordinance applies. Schedule.

(2) The Governor in Council may order that any such trade or craft as aforesaid shall be omitted from the schedule and thereupon this Ordinance shall no longer apply to that trade or craft.
