An Ordinance to provide for the Regulation of the Sale and disposal of Molasses.

[24TH OCTOBER, 1931.]

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Molasses (Disposal) Ordinance.

Records of sale and disposal of molasses.

2. (1) Every person who except for export from the Colony sells or otherwise disposes of molasses to some other person shall keep at the place of sale or disposal a book (hereinafter referred to as "the molasses disposal book") in which he shall record the quantity of molasses sold or disposed of, the date of sale or disposition, the date of delivery, the name and address of the buyer or person to whom disposed of and of the person to whom delivered, and the consideration for the sale or disposition, and the purpose for which obtained.

(2) The entries in the molasses disposal book shall be made in such manner and form as the Commissioner of Police may from time to time prescribe by notice in the Gazette and a

**CHAPTER 124.**

**SUGAR (REGULATION OF PRICES).**

**An Ordinance to regulate the retail price of Sugar within the Colony.** 15 of 1930.

[23RD JUNE, 1930.]

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Sugar (Regulation of Prices) Ordinance. Short title.

2. The Governor may whenever in his opinion the circumstances require by proclamation published in the Gazette fix the maximum prices for which the various grades of sugar manufactured in the Colony may be sold by retail and may at any time revoke, alter or amend any such proclamation. Fixing of retail prices.

3. Any person selling sugar in excess of such maximum retail prices so fixed as aforesaid shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding twenty-five dollars for every such offence. Penalty.

(3) Every person who sells or disposes of molasses as aforesaid shall on the first day of every month transmit to the Commissioner of Police an extract of all entries in the molasses disposal book for the preceding month. 41 of 1933, s. 5.

3. (1) No person shall on the sale or other disposition of molasses as aforesaid deliver more than two gallons thereof on the same day to any other person unless he shall deliver to that person at the same time a certificate of the sale or other disposition thereof. The Commissioner of Police may subject to the approval of the Governor in Council from time to time prescribe forms of certificates and what they shall contain. No molasses exceeding two gallons to be sold, delivered or removed without certificate. 31 of 1937, s. 4 and sch.

(2) No person shall remove more than two gallons of molasses from the place of sale or disposal unless he has received a certificate as provided by subsection (1) of this section.

4. Before the delivery of molasses to any person under sections 2 and 3 of this Ordinance, such person shall state in writing signed by him the purpose for which he desires to obtain the molasses. The statement shall be delivered to and kept by the person who delivers the molasses and shall be open to inspection in the same manner and by the same persons mentioned in subsection (2) of section 2 of this Ordinance. 5. Every certificate delivered under subsection (2) of section 3 of this Ordinance shall state the purpose for which the molasses has been obtained. Certificate under sec. 3 (2). 41 of 1933, s. 3.

6. Any person to whom molasses has been delivered under this Ordinance and who uses it or any part thereof for a purpose other than that set forth in the statement required by section 4 and in the certificate delivered under section 5 of this Ordinance shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding two hundred dollars. Penalty for use other than that given. 41 of 1933, s. 4.

7. Every person who transmits an extract of entries in pursuance of subsection (3) of section 2 of this Ordinance shall at the same time transmit to the Commissioner of Police a copy of every statement which has been delivered during the preceding month under section 4 of this Ordinance. Copy of statement delivered under sec. 4 to be sent to Commissioner of Police. 41 of 1933, s. 6 (1).

8. (1) Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of sections 2, 3 and 6 of this Ordinance shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five hundred dollars and if convicted of a second or subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding one thousand dollars or to imprisonment with or without hard labour not exceeding six months.

(2) Where any person is convicted in respect of the sale or other disposition or the delivery or removal of any molasses in contravention of any of the provisions of this Ordinance the molasses shall be forfeited.

9. Any person who acts in contravention of subsection (2) of section 3 of this Ordinance may be arrested without warrant by any district commissioner\* police constable or officer of customs.

10. Any person acting in contravention of this Ordinance may be prosecuted and punished under the Summary Jurisdiction Ordinances.
