CHAPTER 135.

**MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS (TEMPORARY
REGISTRATION).**

An Ordinance to provide for the temporary registration of certain medical practitioners for the purposes of the Colonial Medical Service Ordinance. 24 of 1947.

[26TH JULY, 1947.]

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Medical Practitioners (Temporary Registration) Ordinance. Short title.

2. In this Ordinance—
“ the Board ” means the Medical Board established under section 16 of the Colonial Medical Service Ordinance. Interpreta-

3. Anything to the contrary contained in section 25 of the Colonial Medical Service Ordinance notwithstanding, where on the application of any person it is shown to the satisfaction of the Board that that person fulfils the conditions hereinafter specified, the Board may, if they think fit, direct that his name be placed on the register of medical practitioners and on that direction being given the secretary of the Board shall register that person accordingly : Temporary

Provided that, without prejudice to the provisions of section 35 of the Colonial Medical Service Ordinance, a person registered by virtue of this Ordinance shall cease to be registered on the expiration thereof.

4. Any person who desires to be registered by virtue of this Ordinance shall be required to satisfy the Board—

(a) that he is of good character ;

(b) that he holds a medical diploma or diplomas granted in any place outside the Colony which shall be a diploma or diplomas recognised for the time being by the Board for the purpose of this Ordinance as furnishing a sufficient guarantee of the possession of the requisite knowledge and skill for the efficient practice of medicine or surgery ; and

(c) that he is employed, or has been selected for employment, in the government medical service or in any institution or service which for the time being is approved by the Governor.

Duration of
Ordinance.

5. Subject to the provisions of this section, this Ordinance shall continue in force up to and including the 31st December, 1951 :

Provided that the Legislative Council may, prior to the expiration of this Ordinance, by resolution (which resolution shall be published in the Gazette) declare that this Ordinance shall continue in force for a further period of one year from the date of that expiration and may from time to time, prior to the expiration of that or any further continued operation, similarly declare that it shall continue for a further period of one year.*
