BRITISH GUIANA

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, (Chapter 132).

UNDER SECTION 63 (5) OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Wireless Telegraphy (Amendment) Regulations, 1964, and shall be construed and read as one with the Wireless Telegraphy Regulations*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.
- 2. Regulation 10 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor —
- "Persons to whom Amateur Licences granted and purpose of use of apparatus, Schedule C.
- 10. An Amateur Licence may be granted to a *bona fide* amateur or experimenter authorising him to establish and use a station for the purpose of transmitting and receiving messages or conducting scientific experiments; a licence granted hereunder shall be in the form in schedule C or in such other form and subject to such other conditions or restrictions as the Director of Posts and Telecommunications may consider necessary."
- 3. Regulation 12 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor —
- "Applicant for an Amateur Licence to possess a certificate of competency."
- 12. An Amateur Licence shall not be granted to a person who does not possess the certificate of competency referred to in the following regulation, provided that a licence may be granted in special circumstances to a person not possessing such certificate —

- (a) where it is intended that a person who possesses such a certificate shall always be in charge of the station; or
- (b) in the case of a station to be used telephonically, where the Director of Posts and Telecommunications is satisfied that a person by reason of his previous experience notwithstanding his lack of knowledge of the morse code is qualified to operate such a station."
