THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ACT

(Cap. 47:01)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON ME BY SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:-

- 1. These Regulations, which amend the Private Letter Ciution Boxes Regulations*, may be cited as the Private Letter Boxes (Amendment) Regulations 1989.
- 2. Regulation 9 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for all the words beginning with "A deposit" and ending with "each key" of the words "A Regulations. deposit of one hundred and twenty-five dollars on account of each key".

Amendment 3. Regulation 10 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for all the words beginning with
