THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ACT

(Cap. 47:01)

IN EXERCISE OF THE POWERS CONFERRED UPON THE MINISTER BY SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ACT, I HEREBY MAKE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS:—

1. These Regulations, which amend the Telephone Regulations*, may be cited as the Telephone (Amendment) Regulations 1989. Citation

2. Regulation 9(2) of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for the words "\$15.00" of the words "\$150.00". Amendment of regulation 9 of the Principal Regulations

3. Schedule A to the Principal Regulations is hereby amended in the following respects — Amendment of Schedule A of the Principal Regulations,

- (a) in paragraph 1 (2) (i), by the substitution for the words "\$360.00" and "\$144.00" of the words "\$1020.00" and "\$420.00" respectively;
