REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE FACTORIES ORDINANCE

(Chapter 115)

UNDER SECTION 26 OF THE FACTORIES ORDINANCE, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE ACTING GOVERNOR-GENERAL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Hours of Work (Saw Mill Workers) (Amendment) Regulations, 1966, and shall be construed and read as one with the Hours of Work (Saw Mill Workers) Regulations, 1956, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution of the following definition for the definition of the expression "saw-mill" —

“‘sawmill’ means any place where wood is prepared by mechanical process for building purposes, but does not include a place where the work carried on there consists essentially of cabinet-making or the manufacture of sash windows or ornamental work in wood.”
