REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE, (Chapter 280)

- UNDER SECTION 35 OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES AND ROAD TRAFFIC ORDINANCE AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR-GENERAL:—
- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic (Amendment) Regulations, 1968.
- 2. The following schedule is substituted for the second schedule to the Motor Vehicles and Road Traffic Ordinance —

SECOND SCHEDULE

Limit of Speeds

 (a) on restricted roads.
 .25

 (b) elsewhere.
 .40

 Motor tractors.

Other motor vehicles:

Provided that the Licensing Authority with the approval of the Governor-General, may fix the maximum speed for any class of vehicle in any village and such limit may be indicated by notice in such manner as the Licensing Authority may decide.

For the purpose of this schedule restricted roads shall be —

- 1. Roads in the city of Georgetown.
- 2. The main road on the East Bank, Demerara, in and between Plantations Ruimveldt and Grove, and between Plantation Coverden and the airport at Atkinson Field.
- 3. The main road on the East Coast, Demerara, from the city of Georgetown to the eastern boundary of Plantation Hope.
- 4. Roads in the town of New Amsterdam.
- 5. Roads in the Mackenzie area.
- 6. Roads in the village of Bartica.

For the purpose of this schedule --

- (a) the city of Georgetown shall be that area the boundaries of which are as defined in section 4(1) of the Georgetown Town Council Ordinance;
- (b) the town of New Amsterdam shall be that area the boundaries of which are as defined in the first schedule to the New Amsterdam Town Council Ordinance;
- (c) the Mackenzie area shall be that area situate on the right bank of the Demerara River commencing from the Kara-Kara River and extending up the left bank of the Kara-Kara River to the Shibaru Creek thence up the left bank of the Shibaru Creek to its source and thence in a straight line due west to the right bank of the Demerara River at Three Friends;
- (d) the village of Bartica shall be that area situate on the left bank of the Essequibo River near to its junction with the Mazaruni River, bounded on the north and east by the Essequibo River, on the south by the left bank Mongrippa Creek, and on the west by Crown land adjoining Seventh Avenue and the Burial Ground.

The Licensing Authority may declare any road to be a restricted road for the purposes of this schedule by the publication of a notice to this effect in the Gazette and in a newspaper circulating in Guyana."
