REGULATIONS MADE IN PURSUANCE OF THE ANIMALS DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Animals Diseases Short Title. Regulations, 1937.
- 2. No animal shall be exported before it is inspected by the Government Veterinary Surgeon or a Veterinary Surgeon appointed by the Director of Agriculture and is certified to be free from disease and fit and suitable for export.

Animals to be inspected by a Veterinary Surgeon before export.

3. No animal shall be exported by sea in any ship which in the opinion of the Government Veterinary Surgeon is not suitably fitted for the carriage of such animal.

Animals to be exported only in suitably fitted ships.

4. The scale of fees chargeable for inspection at ports of entry is Scale of fees as follows:-

chargeable for

On importation—Horses, donkeys and mules.. \$2.00 per animal. inspection. Any other animal ...\$1.00 ,,

On exportation—Free if inspection is made by a Government Veterinary Officer.
