REGULATIONS TO AMEND THE POST OFFICE TELE-GRAPH REGULATIONS, 1904, WITH RESPECT TO THE CHARGES ON TELEGRAMS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Telegraph Short title. Regulations, 1939, and shall be read as one with the Post Office Telegraph Regulations, 1904, (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations).

2. The following shall be inserted as Regulation 2 of the Principal New Regula-Regulations:

- "The classes of telegrams transmitted over the Post Office Inland Telegraph System and the charges therefor shall be as shown in the Schedule to these Regulations."
- 3. Regulation 6 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked New Regulaand the following substituted therefor :-

tion 6. insorted.

"The charges for transmission of an inland telegram and for any porterage or accessory service connected therewith shall be prepaid by means of postage stamps affixed to the telegram form by the sender:

Provided that the Postmaster-General may accept without prepayment—

(1) telegrams telephoned by a telephone renter to a telegraph office for transmission;

- (2) telegrams handed in by a person or company having a deposit account with the Postmaster-General for the purpose of covering charges on telegrams;
- (3) telegrams sent "collect" by arrangement with the Postmaster-General whereby the addressee undertakes to pay the charges on delivery."

New Schedule 4. The Schedule to these Regulations shall be inserted as the Schedule to the Principal Regulations.

Revocation of previous Regulations.

5. The Post Office Telegraph Regulations, 1936, and the Post Office Telegraph Regulations, 1938, are hereby revoked.

Commencement. 6. These Regulations shall come into force with effect as from the 15th day of April, 1939.

Note 1.—Telegrams of this class can be accepted for transmission as "Urgent" over the land line system, at double rate, but cannot be accepted for transmission as "Urgent" over the Wireless System, or to ships.

Note 2.-In direction ship to shore only.

- 4. (1) Delivery of telegrams received at offices of the inland land-line system s effected free within one mile of the office of destination.
- (2) Delivery of telegrams received at Stations of the Inland Radio Telegraph System is effected free by the first opportunity, but senders may prepay the cost of special delivery if such can be effected. The cost of special delivery can only be obtained from the office of destination and will vary according to circumstances. No charge will be made for obtaining this information.
- (3) Urgent telegrams cannot be accepted for transmission over the Inland Radio Telegraph System.
- (4) For the purpose of assessment of charges on telegrams and delivery of same, Bartica Radio Station shall be deemed to be an office of the landline system
