REGULATIONS MADE UNDER THE COLONIAL MEDICAL SERVICE (CONSOLIDATION) ORDINANCE. (Chapter 186).

Under Section 39 A. (6) of the Colonial Medical Service (CONSOLIDATION) ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE MEDICAL BOARD WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:-

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Dentists (Prescribed Short Title. Examination) Regulations, 1939.
 - 2. In these Regulations—
 - "the Board" means the Medical Board established under Interpretasection 16 of the Colonial Medical Service (Consolidation) Cap. 186. Ordinance.

3. The same examination shall be held for persons whose names are entered in the "List of Dental Mechanics" referred to in regulation 20 of Part IV of the Dentists Registration (Special Exemption Groups) Regulations, 1939, and for persons whose names are entered in the "List of Practitioners for less than five years" referred to in regulations 32 and 34 of Part V of the said Regulations.

Scope of examinaDates and place of examinations.

4. The examinations shall be held in Georgetown in July, 1940, and at such other times as may be fixed by the Board of which notice shall be given in the *Gazette*.

Appointment of examiners. 5. Prior to each examination, the examiners shall be appointed by the Board. The examiners shall be paid such fees as may from time to time be decided by the Board.

Re-examination. 6. Candidates who fail at an examination shall not be admitted to re-examination until after the expiration of at least three months from such examination.

Method of examina-

7. The examination shall be written, oral and practical.

Subjects of examination

- 8. Candidates shall be required to satisfy the examiners that they possess:—
- (1) a sufficient knowledge of the anatomy of the teeth, mouth, accessory sinuses and associated parts;

(2) an elementary knowledge of respiration and circulation;

- (3) an elementary knowledge of the processes of inflammation, suppuration, ulceration and wound infection, and the healing of wounds;
 - (4) a knowledge of the nature of syphilis and its manifestations in the mouth:
- (5) an elementary knowledge of new growths commonly present in the mouth;
- (6) a sufficient knowledge of the instruments, tools, appliances, drugs and materials commonly employed in the practice of dentistry;
- (7) a knowledge of the practical means of sterilising instruments and other appliances, and the use of antiseptics in dental practice;

(8) a knowledge of anaesthetics (local and general, their administration, and the dangers incidental to their use;

(9) a degree of knowledge and skill sufficient to warrant the performance of the ordinary operations of dentistry and the giving of treatment, advice and attendance in simple dental cases; and

(10) a sufficient degree of knowledge and skill in the practice

of dental mechanics.
