REGULATIONS TO AMEND THE GOVERNMENT COUNTY SCHOLARSHIP REGULATIONS, 1931.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Government County Short title. Scholarship (Amendment) Regulations, 1938, and shall be construed with the Government County Scholarship Regulations, 1931, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

- (a) is a British subject.
- (b) is under 12 years of age on the thirty-first day of May in the year of the examination.
- (c) has had his or her usual place of residence in the Colony-
 - (i) if a native of the Colony, for a period of not less than three years immediately preceding the first day of the examination; and
 - (ii) if not a native of the Colony, for a period of not less than five years immediately preceding the first day of the examination.
- (d) has not at any time during the two years immediately preceding the examination, attended a school at which a Government County Scholarship is tenable."

Amendment to Regulation 10 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by inserting the words "commencing from the 1st September and the Principal ending on the 31st August of the succeeding year" after the word Regulations. "terms" in the third line.

New regulation inserted in Principal Regulations.

4. The following regulation shall be inserted in the Principal Regulations as Regulation 13A thereof—

"Extension of Scholarship. 13A. If the holder of a Scholarship qualifies for the School Certificate of a recognised Schools Examination Board with credits in four or more subjects including English, the Governor may extend the Scholarship for such period as the holder is eligible to sit as a candidate for the British Guiana Scholarship. During any period of extension the Scholar shall be entitled to the benefits of the Scholarship as stated in Regulation 10, but shall be subject to the provisions of Regulation 14."

Date of 5. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on Commencement, 1938.
