REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, (Chapter 185).

UNDER SECTION 94 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Telegraph (Amendment) Regulations, 1947, and shall be construed with the Post Office Telegraph Regulations, 1904, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.
- 2. The Schedule to the Principal Regulations as inserted by regulation 4 of the Post Office Telegraph Regulations, 1939, and amended by regulation 2 of the Post Office Telegraph (Amendment) Regulations, 1942,* is hereby further amended by the substitution of the following sub-paragraph for sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 1 thereof—
 - "(1) Telegrams transmitted over the land line system only and delivery of same within one mile of the telegraph office of destination—
 - (a) Ordinary Telegrams—
 First 12 words or portion thereof 18c.
 Each additional word 1c.
 - (b) Urgent Telegrams—
 First 12 words or portion thereof 36c.
 Each additional word 2c.
 - (c) Press Telegrams—
 First 12 words or portion thereof 18c.
 Each additional word ¹/₄c.
 - (d) Urgent Press Telegrams—
 First 12 words or portion thereof 18c.
 Each additional word 1c."

- 3. The Post Office Telegraph (Amendment) Regulations, 1942,* are hereby revoked.
- 4. These Regulations shall come into force on the 15th day of July, 1947.
