

**BRITISH GUIANA**

## REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER  
THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,  
(Chapter 185).

UNDER SECTION 94 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, AS AMENDED BY SECTION 4 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, 1935. THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE POSTMASTER GENERAL WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office Telegraph (Amendment) Regulations, 1953, and shall be construed and read as one with the Post Office Telegraph Regulations, 1904, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations and any Regulations amending the same.

2. Paragraph 2 of the schedule to the Principal Regulations as substituted by regulation 2 of the Post Office Telegraph (Amendment) Regulations, 1941 \* \*, is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor:—

“2. Commonwealth and Foreign Telegrams:—

Urgent telegrams are not accepted over the inland wireless system.”

3. These Regulations shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1953.
