REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE LABOUR ORDINANCE, 1942

(No. 2 of 1942)

UNDER SECTION 35 (1) OF THE LABOUR ORDINANCE, 1942
THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE
BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Hours of Work (Watchmen) Regulations, 1953.
2. In these Regulations —
“watchman” means any person employed to watch or guard any premises other than private dwelling places, but includes a person employed otherwise than by the resident to watch or guard a private dwelling place provided as a condition of employment.
3. The number of hours which may normally be worked by a watchman in any week shall not exceed 64.
4. Any person who commits a breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of fifty dollars.
5. The Hours of Work (Georgetown and New Amsterdam Watchmen) Regulations, 1948*, are hereby revoked.
