REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936,
(No. 29 of 1936).

UNDER SECTION 36 OF THE ANIMAL DISEASES ORDINANCE, 1936, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Animal Diseases (Movement of Livestock) Regulations, 1953.

2. In these Regulations —
“livestock” shall not include poultry.

3. (1) No person shall move, take or carry any livestock from the area described in the Schedule hereto to any other part of the Colony.

(2) Any person who commits a breach of this regulation shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred dollars.

SCHEDULE

(Description of Area).

That area, bounded on the North and East by the Atlantic Ocean, on the South by the Supernaam River and on the West by the Pomeroon River and an imaginary line joining the source of the Pomeroon River to the source of the Supernaam River.
