# **BRITISH GUIANA**

#### REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ORDINANCE, 1953 (No. 5 of 1953).

UNDER SECTION 41 OF THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ORDINANCE, 1953, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Representation of the People Regulations, 1953.

2. In these Regulations—

"the Ordinance" means the Representation of the People Ordinance, 1953;

"regulation" means a regulation of these Regulations; "Schedule" means a schedule to these Regulations; "voter" shall where the context so requires include a

person voting as proxy for a voter.

3. The remuneration to be paid to election officers shall be the sums from time to time fixed by the Governor.

Conveniences to be supplied to presiding officer for the taking of the poll.

- 4. The returning officer shall supply every presiding officer—
  - (a) with such number of proper ballot boxes in respect of each candidate who has been duly nominated, as are equivalent to the number of voting compartments in the polling-place to which the presiding officer has been appointed to preside;

(b) with an instrument for stamping thereon the

official mark;

(c) with a copy of the official list or such part thereof as contains the names of the voters entitled to vote at the polling-place at which he is appointed to preside, certified under the hand of the returning officer;

(d) with a sufficient number of ballot tickets and tendered ballot tickets;

(e) with such other conveniences for taking the poll as may be necessary.

5. (1) Each polling-place shall be furnished with such numcer of compartments in which the voters can cast their votes as the returning officer thinks necessary.

(2) Each compartment shall be so screened that no person other than the person voting can see the ballot boxes.

(3) Several compartments may be constructed in the same room.

(4) The presiding officer may in his discretion at any time during polling day alter the position of any of the ballot boxes in any compartment.

Voting compartments at polling-places.

6. (1) The returning officer shall take measures in advance Preparation of to ensure that every polling-place is provided, before the com- polling-mencement of the taking of the poll, with proper doors, barriers, places and tables, chairs and other conveniences, and that the same are the taking properly arranged for carrying out the purposes of the Ordinance of the and of these Regulations.

(2) He shall, on or before the day fixed for the taking of the poll and before the commencement of the taking thereof, if convenient for him so to do visit every polling-place and see that every polling-place is provided with doors, barriers, tables, chairs and conveniences as aforesaid and that the same are pro-

perly arranged as aforesaid in every polling-place.

7. (1) An election agent may appoint one polling agent in Appoint-

each polling-place.

Three clear days before the polling, the election agents. agent shall declare in writing in Form No. 2 in the Schedule, the Form No. name and address of every polling agent so appointed, to the 2 Schedule. returning officer who shall forthwith give public notice of the name and address of every polling agent so declared by causing placards to be affixed in a conspicuous position, on such pollingplaces, churches, chapels, court-houses, post offices and police stations in the electoral district as the returning officer may deem necessary.

(1) Every application for the appointment of a proxy Appoint. shall reach the returning officer not later than the day before proxy. the last day for the delivery of nomination papers and if received after that day shall be disregarded.

- (2) For the purpose of ascertaining in pursuance of subsection (4) of section 29 of the Ordinance that a proxy is capable of being and willing to be appointed, the returning officer shall, unless he is satisfied that the person nominated in the application is not capable of being and willing to be appointed, notify him that a proxy paper will be issued to him unless within five days from the date of such notice the returning officer receives notice from him that he is not capable of being and willing to be appointed.
- (3) If for any reason the returning officer does not issue a proxy paper in pursuance of an application made to him, he shall notify the person making the application why he has not done so.

As soon as may be after issue of the proxy paper the (4)returning officer shall send a notice of the fact to the voter.

(5) Where the appointment of a proxy is cancelled by notice given to the returning officer, the returning officer shall forthwith remove his name from the record of proxies.

- (6) A notice cancelling the appointment of a proxy shall be disregarded if it is received by the returning officer on or after the day before the last day for the delivery of nomination papers.
- 9. For the guidance of voters printed notices in conspicuous Directions characters (English, Urdu and Nagri) shall be placarded in vari- to voters. ous places outside and inside every polling-place in the following form:

## DIRECTIONS FOR VOTING

You can vote for one candidate at this election. (1)

(2)When you are about to cast your vote, show an election officer the official mark on your ballot ticket and then put your ballot ticket into the ballot box bearing the name, photograph, symbol, and where allocated the colour, of the candidate for whom you desire to cast your vote and leave the polling-place.

Poll cards.

10. (1) Each voter at any polling-place shall state to the poll clerk at that polling-place appointed for that purpose his name, occupation, place of residence and postal address (as should appear on the official list or part thereof for the polling-place).

(2) Every person voting as proxy for a voter at any polling-place shall state to the poll clerk at that polling-place appointed for that purpose his name and address and the name, occupation, place of residence and postal address of the person on whose behalf he is appointed to vote as proxy (as should appear

on the official list or part thereof for the polling-place).

(3) Any information given to a poll clerk in pursuance of subregulation (1) or subregulation (2) of this regulation together with such other information the poll clerk may deem necessary shall be entered by a poll clerk appointed for that purpose on a poll card which shall be in such form as the Registration Officer may direct and the poll card shall be given to the voter or proxy as the case may be.

11. Each person on coming to vote shall hand to the presid-Duty of ing officer or assistant presiding officer a poll card duly filled voter on in by a poll clerk.

12. (1) The presiding officer or assistant presiding officer if he finds that the name of such person is in the official list may in his discretion, and if requested by a candidate or his agent shall, put to the voter the following questions, or any one or more of them, and no other —

in the case of a person applying as a voter—

are you the person whose name and particulars are entered in the official list as follows (read the whole entry from the official list)?

have you already voted, here or elsewhere, at (ii) this general election otherwise than as proxy for some other person?

(b) in the case of a person applying as proxy—

are you the person whose name appears as A.B. in the list of proxies for this election as entitled to vote as proxy on behalf of C.D.?

have you already voted here or elsewhere at this general election as proxy on behalf of C.D.?

(2) In the case of a person applying as proxy, the presiding officer or the assistant presiding officer may, and if required as aforesaid shall, put the following additional question—

Are you the husband (wife), parent, grandparent, brother (sister), child or grandchild?

and if that question is not answered in the affirmative the following question—

(3) A ballot ticket shall not be delivered to any person required to answer the above questions or any of them unless

he has answered the questions or question satisfactorily.

Save as by this regulation authorised, no inquiry shall

be permitted as to the right of any person to vote.

13. In case the presiding officer or the assistant presiding Poll at officer shall see fit to dispense with the questions aforesaid or the elections. same shall be answered satisfactorily the ballot of the voter shall

14. (1) The presiding officer, or the assistant presiding officer, Procedure after having delivered to the voter a ballot ticket, and while the on voting. voter is recording his vote, shall make a mark against the name of the voter on his copy of the official list to indicate that such voter has voted at the election, but not so as to show the particular ballot ticket given to such voter.

(2) The voter having voted shall forthwith show to the poll clerk to whom he has before voting shown the official mark on the ballot ticket that his hands are empty and shall forthwith

leave the polling-place.

15. The returning officer, the presiding officer, the assistant Instrucpresiding officer or the poll clerk appointed for duty in accordance tions by presiding with section 32 (5) of the Ordinance, shall on request give such officers. instructions as may appear to be necessary to any voter as to the

manner in which he should record his vote.

16. No person shall be admitted within any polling-place Who are during the hours appointed for taking the poll except the return- to be ing officer, the presiding officer, the assistant presiding officer, the poll clerks, the candidates, one agent appointed for a candidate within the polling-by the candidate in writing, and such number of voters at a place time as the presiding officer may think fit, but such number shall not exceed three times the number of voting compartments (other than a voting compartment set apart for the casting of tendered ballot tickets) in the polling-place.

17. The candidates or their agents shall be posted in such a Candidates place that they can see each person who presents himself as a voter and agents and interfere in the precedings to the extent allowed by these how to and interfere in the proceedings to the extent allowed by these be placed, Regulations, but so that they cannot see how any voter votes or

otherwise interfere.

18. (1) If any candidate or agent persists after being warned, Preservain misconducting himself or in disobeying any lawful order of the tion of presiding officer or otherwise in contravening any of the provisions order. of these Regulations, the returning officer, the presiding officer or the assistant presiding officer may have him removed out of the polling-place and the person so removed shall not without the permission of the presiding officer again enter the polling-place - during polling day.

(2) Any person so removed may if charged with the commission in the polling-place of an offence be dealt with as a person taken into custody by a constable for an offence without a

warrant.

The powers conferred by this regulation shall not be exercised so as to prevent a voter who is otherwise entitled to vote at a polling-place from having an opportunity of voting at that polling-place.

The returning officer, the presiding officer or the assistant presiding officer may at any time summon within the polling-place for the purpose of preserving order, constables or other persons appointed by the Commissioner of Police for that

purpose.

19. Every voter shall vote without undue delay, and shall vote with- quit the polling-place as soon as he has put his ballot ticket in a out undue dallot box.

As to a person claiming to vote a voter after another voted as such voter.

20. If a person representing himself to be a particular voter named in the official list applies for a ballot ticket after another person has voted as such voter, the applicant shall on duly answering the questions set forth in regulation 12, be entitled to receive a ballot ticket; but the ballot ticket (hereinafter called a tendered ballot ticket) shall be of a colour differing from the other ballot person has tickets, and, shall be put into a ballot box specially set aside for tendered ballot tickets and bearing the name, photograph, symbol and where allocated the colour of the candidate for whom the person desires to vote after being endorsed by the presiding officer or the assistant presiding officer with the name of the voter and his number in the official list. The name of the voter and his number in the official list shall be entered on a list to be called the Tendered Votes List and against each such entry there shall be affixed the voter's signature or if he cannot write, his thumb impression.

As to spoilt ballot tickets.

- 21. (1) A voter who has inadvertently dealt with his ballot ticket in such a manner that it cannot be conveniently used as a ballot ticket may, on delivering to the returning officer, the presiding officer or the assistant presiding officer the ballot ticket so inadvertently dealt with, and on proving the fact of the inadvertence to the satisfaction of the returning officer, the presiding officer or the assistant presiding officer, obtain another ballot ticket in the place of the ballot ticket so delivered up (hereinafter called a spoilt ballot ticket), and the spoilt ballot ticket shall be immediately cancelled by the returning officer, presiding officer or assistant presiding officer writing the word "cancelled" across the face of the same, and of the counterfoil thereof.
- All tickets cancelled by a presiding officer or by an assistant presiding officer shall be preserved by him and given, inafter mentioned.
- Ballot Every ballot box shall be of convenient size, and shall be so constructed that the ballot ticket can be introduced therein particulars but cannot be withdrawn without the box being unlocked and in

the case of a ballot box in which tendered ballot tickets are to be

cast without the box being unsealed.

(2) Every ballot box shall be exhibited empty to such persons as may be in the polling-place immediately before the taking of the poll, and shall then be securely locked or sealed as the case may be, and not be again unlocked or unsealed as the case may be except at the close of the poll when it shall be dealt with in the manner mentioned in section 32 of the Ordinance.

The presiding officer at each polling-place, as soon as Duty of practicable after the close of the poll, shall, in the presence of such presiding candidates and agents as may be in attendance, make up into officer at separate packets, sealed with his own seal and the seals of such pollingcandidates or their agents who desire to affix their seals:

(a) each group of ballot boxes in use at each voting close of compartment of his polling-place, each ballot box the poll. being unopened and so sealed so as to prevent

the introduction of additional ballot tickets;

the unused and the spoilt ballot tickets placed to-(b) gether;

(c) the counterfoils of all used and spoilt ballot tickets,

and of tendered ballot tickets;

(d) the copies of the official lists of voters or parts thereof as marked by the presiding officer or the assistant presiding officer under regulation 14 (1);

(e) the Tendered Votes List; and

the list of voters whose votes have been cast by the presiding officer under section 33 of the Ordinance —

and shall, with all convenient speed, hasten to the head polling-

place and deliver the packets to the returning officer.

The returning officer, as soon as practicable after the close Duty of of the poll, shall, in the presence of such candidates and agents presiding

as may be in attendance, proceed as follows:—

He shall before opening any ballot-box, compare of the the several marked copies of the official lists for the poll. electoral district used at the polling-places, so as to ascertain whether a vote has been taken in the name of the same voter at more than one pollingplace and if any vote has been so taken, shall record in writing the polling-places at which it has been taken and the number of the voter in the official lists.

He shall examine the seals on each ballot box and (b) note whether they show any signs of having been

tampered with.

He shall without mixing the contents of any ballot (c) box with those of any other count the ballot tickets in each box and the unused and spoilt ballot tickets, so as to ascertain whether those tickets, so as to so as to ascertain whether those tickets, together with those which from the Tendered Votes List appear to have been used for tendered votes, account for all the ballot tickets with which such polling-

places were provided by him, and shall record in

writing the result of such examination.

(d) If from the comparison mentioned in paragraph (c) of this regulation it appears that no vote has been taken at such polling-place in the name of a voter who has voted at some other polling-place or such vote at such other polling-place has not been counted, the returning officer shall count the votes contained in each ballot box, recording as he proceeds the number of votes given for each candidate at each voting compartment of each pollingplace.

(e) If from such comparison it appears that any such vote has been taken at such polling-place, and a vote in the name of such voter at another pollingplace has been counted, the returning officer shall open the sealed packet of counterfoils and refer to the number thereon and on the face of the ballot ticket so as to ascertain which ballot ticket is to be rejected, and having excluded such ticket shall proceed to count the votes as hereinbefore provided.

- (f) The returning officer after counting the votes contained in each ballot box, recording as he proceeds the number of votes given for each candidate at each voting compartment at each polling-place shall
  - (i) make up into separate packets the ballot tickets from each ballot box, affixing to each such packet a label bearing the name of the candidate and the number and other marks of identification of the votoing compartment and polling-place from which the ballot box came;
- (ii) make up the packets referred to in subparagraph (i) of this paragraph into separate larger packets relating to each voting compartment, writing on each such larger packet the number and other marks of identification of the voting compartment and polling-place from which the ballot boxes came; and
- (iii) make up the packets referred to in sub-paragraph (ii) of this paragraph into one packet together with all other papers and documents from the same polling-place, and the record of the result of the examination mentioned in this regulation, and shall write on such packet the name of the polling-place from which such papers and documents came and shall seal up such packet so that the same cannot be opened without breaking the seals.
- (g) The returning officer shall, so far as practicable, proceed continuously with counting the votes, allowing only time for refreshment, and excluding (except so far as he and the candidates or their agents otherwise agree) the hours between seven o'clock at night and nine o'clock on the succeeding

morning. During the excluded time the returning officer shall place the ballot tickets and other documents relating to the election under his own seal and the seals of such of the agents of the candidates as desire to affix their seals, and shall otherwise take proper precautions for the security of such papers and documents.

While counting the ballot tickets and in counting (h) the votes the returning officer shall keep the ballot tickets with their faces downwards and take all proper precautions for preventing any person from seeing the numbers printed on the faces of such

Save as provided for in paragraph (e) of this (i) regulation and so far as may be necessary to comply with that paragraph, the returning officer shall not open the sealed packet of counterfoils coming from any polling-place or refer to the numbers thereon or to the numbers on the faces of the ballot tickets.

- The returning officer shall not open the ballot boxes containing tendered ballot tickets coming from any polling-place except for the purpose of making up such ballot tickets into parcels and of writing on each parcel the name of the candidate for whom the tendered votes were cast and the number and other marks of identification of the polling-place at which the tendered votes were cast, all such parcels to be made up into one larger parcel which shall immediately thereafter be sealed by

(1) The returning officer shall endorse the word "re- Rejected jected" on any ballot ticket which he may reject as invalid, and ballot shall add to the endorsement the words "rejection objected to" if and report any objection be in fact made by a candidate or his agent to his thereon. decision.

(2) The returning officer shall report to the Governor the number of ballot tickets rejected and not counted by him under the several heads of—

and shall, at the request of any candidate or his agent, allow him to copy the report before it is sent to the Governor.

(3) The report shall be published in the Gazette.

Returns as to voting at each pollingplace to be sent to the Governor.

27. Together with or as soon as may be after the return of the writ to the Governor as directed by section 36 of the Ordinance, the returning officer shall make a further return to the Governor, showing, in relation to each polling-place.

(a) the number of persons who appear to have voted;

(b) the number of spoilt ballot tickets delivered to the returning officer under regulation 23(b);

(c) the number of persons to whom, from the counterfoils, ballot tickets appear to have been supplied; and

(d) the number of votes given to each candidate.

28. (1) The returning officer shall, as soon as may be after the return mentioned in regulation 27, transmit to the Clerk of the House of Assembly, together with the statutory declarations which he is required to forward under subsection (3) of section 18 of the Ordinance the declarations and notices of appointment of election agents, sub-agents and polling agents which have been delivered to him with reference to the election.

(2) Any person shall be entitled to obtain, from the officer mentioned in sub-regulation (1) of this regulation in whose custody the statutory declarations and the declarations and notices of appointment then are, copies of those documents, or any of them, duly certified by the said officer, on payment of a copying fee of twelve cents for every one hundred and twenty words or

part thereof.

(3) The returning officer shall, as soon as may be after the return mentioned in regulation 27, make up into one parcel the different parcels of voting papers, counterfoils, marked copies of the official lists and other papers used at the election (but not including the documents specified in sub-regulation (1) of this regulation), and seal up the same, so that such parcel cannot be opened without breaking the seals, and shall deliver or send by registered post the said parcel to the Clerk of the House of Assembly.

Except as is in this regulation otherwise provided, the Clerk of the House of Assembly shall keep the said parcel in safe custody and shall allow no person to have access to the same.

(5) After the expiration of one year from the date of an election, the Clerk of the House of Assembly may, without breaking the seal of the said parcel, burn the said parcel of papers

used at the election.

(6) When an election petition is presented to the Supreme Court under section 80 of the Legislative Council (Elections) Ordinance, 1945, a Judge of the Supreme Court may make an order requiring the Clerk of the House of Assembly to deliver to such Judge the sealed parcel containing the papers of the election to which the election petition relates, and the Clerk shall thereupon deliver to such Judge the said sealed parcel which was sent to him under sub-regulation (3) of this regulation.

30. In reckoning time for the purposes of these Regulations, Reckoning public holidays shall be excluded, and where anything is required of time. by these Regulations to be done on any day which falls on a public holiday, such thing may be done on the next day not being itself a public holiday.
