

# BRITISH GUIANA

## REGULATIONS

### MADE UNDER

### THE LABOUR ORDINANCE, 1942, (No. 2 of 1942).

UNDER SECTION 35 (1) OF THE LABOUR ORDINANCE, 1942,  
THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE  
BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Hours of Work  
(Watchmen) (No. 2) Regulations, 1953.

2. In these Regulations—

“employer” means any person who employs a watchman;

“watchman” means any person employed to watch or  
guard any premises other than private dwelling  
places, but includes a person employed otherwise  
than by the resident to watch or guard a private  
dwelling place provided as a condition of employ-  
ment.

3. (1) The number of hours which may normally be worked  
by a watchman employed on a weekly, fortnightly or monthly  
basis in any week shall not exceed 60.

(2) The number of hours which may normally be worked  
by a watchman employed otherwise than on a weekly, fortnightly  
or monthly basis in any day shall not exceed 8.

(3) Nothing in this section shall apply to watchmen em-  
ployed in factories.

4. Any person who commits a breach of these Regulations  
shall be liable to a penalty of fifty dollars.

5. The Hours of Work (Watchmen) Regulations, 1953\*, are  
hereby revoked.

6. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into force  
on the Sixth day of August, 1953.
