REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 171).

UNDER SECTION 17 OF THE CROWN LANDS ORDINANCE
THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY
THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Crown Lands (Amendment) Regulations, 1954, and shall be construed and read as one with the Crown Lands Regulations, 1919, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.

2. Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the following sub-regulation —

“(5) Sub-regulation (4) of this regulation shall not apply to applications for woodcutting leases or woodcutting licences. In the case of any such application when a survey of the tract is required the survey fee shall be deposited at the time of the application.”

3. Regulation 48 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for the words “twelve months” of the words “two years”.

4. Regulation 50 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor —

“Rent. 50. The rent payable on a licence or lease shall be at the rate of one cent for each period in respect of which the licence or lease has been granted or renewed as the case may be.”

5. The First Schedule to the Principal Regulations as amended from time to time, is hereby further amended —

(a) (i) by the insertion therein in item 1 after the word “Lease” of the words and brackets “(other than a woodcutting lease)” ;

(ii) by the deletion of the words and commas “, Woodcutting Licence,” in item 1 ;

6. (1) Subject to the provisions of sub-regulation (2) of this regulation, these Regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st January, 1954.

(2) Paragraphs (b) and (c) of regulation 5 of these Regulations shall be deemed to have come into force on the 1st day of April, 1954.

UNDER SECTION 41 OF THE FORESTS ORDINANCE, 1953,
THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE
BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Forests (Amendment) Regulations, 1954, and shall be construed and read as one with the Forests Regulations, 1953, No. 38 of 1953 hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.

2. The First Schedule to the Principal Regulations is hereby amended—
