MADE UNDER

THE CUSTOMS (CONSOLIDATION) ORDINANCE, 1952.

(No. 69 of 1952)

UNDER SECTION 273 OF THE CUSTOMS (CONSOLIDATION) ORDINANCE, 1952, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs (Consolidation) (No. 2) Regulations, 1954, and shall be construed and read as one with the Customs (Consolidation) Regulations, 1952, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations and any Regulations amending the same.

2. Paragraph (e) of sub-regulation (1) of Regulation 153 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended —

(a) by the deletion of the word “colonial” in the seventh line thereof; and

(b) by the deletion of the full stop at the end of the paragraph and the addition thereafter of the words —
“or sold to Her Majesty’s Armed Forces
stationed in the Colony”.

3. These Regulations shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 9th October, 1953.
