REGULATIONS
MADE UNDER
THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 132).

UNDER SECTION 97 (1) OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Official Inland Correspondence (Amendment) Regulations, 1956, and shall be construed and read as one with the Official Inland Correspondence Regulations, 1955*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any regulations amending the same.

2. The following regulation is inserted after regulation 5 of the Principal Regulations —

“Correspondence in relation to St. John Ambulance Brigade and St. John Ambulance Association to be transmitted post free.

5A All inland correspondence, circulars and postal packets passing between the St. John Ambulance Brigade and the St. John Ambulance Association and any person in relation to the business of those organisations shall be transmitted post free”.
