BRITISH GUIANA.

REGULATIONS Made Under THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, (Chapter 132).

UNDER SECTION 97(g) OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE POSTMASTER GENERAL WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR IN COUNCIL:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the British Postal Order (Amendment) Regulations, 1957, and shall be construed and read as one with the British Postal Order Regulations* hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations.

2. Regulation 3 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following regulation is substituted therefor —

"3. The selling price in the Colony of British Postal Orders having the face value indicated in the first column hereunder shall be that set out opposite each denomination in the second column.
