REGULATIONS

Made Under

THE PLANT PROTECTION ORDINANCE,
(Chapter 245).

UNDER SECTION 16 OF THE PLANT PROTECTION ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH (1) OF ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED BY THE GOVERNOR AS FOLLOWS:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Plant Protection (Coconut Disease) (Red Ring) Regulations, 1962.

2. In these Regulations —

“coconut planting material” includes unshelled nuts, seedlings and other parts of the coconut palm except shelled nuts, dried copra, processed fibre and other manufactured products of the coconut.

3. No coconut planting material or soil shall be permitted to leave the areas defined in the schedule to these Regulations without the authority of the Director of Agriculture.

SCHEDULE

- (a) The area of land in the County of Essequibo which is bounded on the east by the Pomeroon River, north by the Atlantic Ocean, west by the Waini River, and South by the Arawapai and Pomeroon Rivers.
- (b) The area of land in the County of Berbice which is Bounded on the north and east by the Canje River, west by the Berbice River and south by the West Canje Public Road which extends from New Amsterdam to Sandvoort.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

These Regulations prohibit the movement of coconut planting materials without the permission of the Director of Agriculture in the areas described due to an outbreak of the Red Ring disease affecting coconut plants.
