REGULATIONS

Made Under

THE LABOUR ORDINANCE. (Chapter 103).

UNDER SECTION 35 OF THE LABOUR ORDINANCE, IN AC-CORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH 1 OF ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA, AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, THE FOLLOWING REGULA-TIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR:-

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Hours of Work citation. (Laundries) Regulations, 1962.

2. In these Regulations— "employee" means any person employed in a laundry; "laundry" means any place where persons are employed by way of trade or business or for purposes of gain in washing, ironing, pressing or dry cleaning of clothing, bed-linen, or table-linen and on all duties incidental thereto; and also where any such persons are employed on any of the afore-mentioned duties incidental to any other trade or business.

3. The number of hours which may normally be worked by any Normal hours employee shall not exceed eight on any day or forty-four in any of work for week, and such normal hours of work shall commence not earlier than 6 o'clock in the morning and end not later than 6 o'clock in the afternoon.

4. No person to whom these Regulations apply shall be em- Holidays. ployed in or about the business of a laundry on any Sunday, Christmas day, the day following Christmas day, or, where Christmas day falls on a Sunday, on any of the two succeeding days, the first week day in $k_{\rm by} R_{\rm eqs} \cdot 1/7i$. January, Good Friday, Easter Monday and Whit Monday;

5. Every hour or part thereof worked by an employee in excess Overtime. of the normal hours shall constitute overtime.

6. Every employee shall be entitled on any day on which he Interval for works to an interval of not less than one hour for a meal, provided meals. that the meal hour shall commence not earlier than 11 o'clock in the morning and not later than 1 o'clock in the afternoon,

Interpretation.

Posting up of 7. It shall be the duty of the employer to keep posted up in a copies of conspicuous place on the premises one or more copies of these Regutions.

Penalty for 8. Any person who commits a breach of these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of fifty dollars.

Revocation. 9. The Hours of Work (Georgetown and New Amsterdam Laundries) Regulations, 1951*, are hereby revoked.
