THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ORDINANCE, 1957, (No. 3 of 1957).

UNDER SECTION 112 OF THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ORDINANCE, 1957, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Representation of the People (Renumeration of Officers) (Amendment) Regulations, 1962, and shall be construed and read with the Representation of the People (Remuneration of Officers) Regulations, 1957*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.
- 2. Regulation 10 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for paragraph (4) of the following paragraph
 - "(4) Subsistence allowances shall be paid to all election officers at the rate of \$3.60 per day on the same conditions as those on which such allowances are payable to public officers, but a public officer who is an election officer and whose subsistence rate when performing duties as a public officer exceeds \$3.60 per day shall, while serving as an election officer, be paid at such higher rate and on the same conditions as he would be paid when performing duties as a public officer:

Provided that this paragraph shall not apply to a polling-place officer unless its application to him is approved by the Chief Electoral Officer".
