REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 132).

UNDER SECTION 97 OF THE POST AND TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE DIRECTOR OF POSTS AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR ACTING IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF:—

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Telegraph Money Orders (Inland) (Amendment) Regulations, 1962, and shall be construed and read as one with the Regulations relating to the issue and payment of telegraph money orders (inland) made by the Postmaster General under section 16 of the Post Office Ordinance, 1880, and approved by the Governor and Court of Policy on the 29th day of September, 1891,* hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.
- 2. Regulation 4 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended by the substitution for the word "fifty" of the words "two hundred and fifty",
