THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939 TO 1963.

- UNDER SECTION 6 OF THE EMERGENCY POWERS ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1939
 TO 1963, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF
 BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS
 ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE
 BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR: -
- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Emergency Powers (Amendment) (No. 3) Regulations, 1963, and shall be construed and read with the Emergency Powers Regulations, 1963*, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.
- 2. The Principal Regulations are hereby amended by the insertion immediately after regulation 26 of the following regulation -
- Looting and kindred offences.
- 26A.(1) Every person who in any area in the Colony to which this regulation applies -
 - (a) breaks and enters, or attempts to break and enter, any shop, store, dwelling-house, outhouse, factory or other building or erection, of whatever description; or
 - (b) unlawfully and maliciously destroys or damages anything in any shop, store, dwellinghouse, outhouse, factory, or other building or erection, of whatever description; or
 - (c) steals any article from any shop, store, dwelling-house, outhouse, factory, or other building or erection, of whatever description, or from any person whatsoever,

shall be guilty of an offence against this regulation.

(2) Any person guilty of an offence against this regulation shall -

- (a) on summary conviction be liable to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three years or to whipping or flogging, or to both such imprisonment and whipping or flogging; or
- (b) on conviction on indictment be liable to imprisonment for life or to whipping or flogging or to both such imprisonment and whipping or flogging.
- (3) This regulation shall apply to such areas in the Colony as the Minister of Home Affairs may by Order provide."
