BRITISH GUIANA

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDINANCE.

(Chapter 237).

UNDER SECTION 7 (1) (g) OF THE ELECTRIC LIGHTING ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR AND APPROVED BY THE LEGISLATURE:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Electric Installation (Amendment) Regulations, 1964, and shall be construed and read as one with the Electric Installation Regulations† hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations and any Regulations amending the same.

2. Regulation 52 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following substituted therefor —

“Accidents
to be
reported.

52. Where any accident by explosion or fire, or any other accident of such kind as to have caused or to be likely to have caused loss of life or personal injury has occurred at any part of any electric line or work, the Undertakers shall forthwith give notice thereof to the Minister for the time being charged with responsibility for electricity and to the Government electric inspector. The Government electric inspector shall, within seventy-two hours of the receipt of such notice, visit the scene of such accident.”
