BRITISH GUIANA

REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE,

(Chapter 309).

UNDER SECTION 273 OF THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 22 OF THE CONSTITUTION OF BRITISH GUIANA AND BY VIRTUE AND IN EXERCISE OF ALL OTHER POWERS ENABLING HIM IN THAT BEHALF, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GOVERNOR:—

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Customs (Amendment) Regulations, 1964, and shall be construed and read as one with the Customs Regulations, hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations, and any Regulations amending the same.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on the 1st July, 1964.

2. The proviso to regulation 170 of the Principal Regulations is hereby amended as follows —

(a) by the substitution of the word “fee” for the word “few” in the first line thereof;

(b) by the substitution of the word “four” for the word “two” appearing in the first line thereof.

3. Regulation 171 of the Principal Regulations is hereby revoked and the following regulation substituted therefor —

“171. (1) The fees as prescribed in this regulation shall be paid by the persons requiring the services of officers at times or on days, other than or in excess of those prescribed in regulation 169:

Provided that —

(a) no fees shall be charged for any period less than fifteen minutes for the rendering of any services to which paragraph (6) of this regulation applies;

(b) the number and category of officers of the Customs and Excise Department required to perform any services shall be determined by the Comptroller.

(2) The fee to be paid for the entering or clearing of a ship, other than a ship engaged in the coasting trade, shall be at the rate of four dollars for each entrance or clearance:

Provided that where two or more applications are made at the same time by the same person, the fee shall be at the rate of two dollars each for every additional entrance or clearance after the first entrance or clearance, as the case may be.

(3) The fee to be paid for the entering or clearing of a ship engaged in the coasting trade shall be at the rate of one dollar for each entrance or clearance.

(4) The fee to be paid for the granting of an application to load shipping stores shall be four dollars.

(5) The fee to be paid for the granting of a supplementary application extending the duration of a service of requiring the employment of additional officers of the Customs and Excise Department shall be four dollars.

(6) In respect of services rendered, other than as mentioned in paragraphs (2) to (5) of this regulation, the fees to be paid shall be determined in accordance with the number of officers of the Customs and Excise Department employed and calculated in accordance with the rates of overtime specified as follows—
