REGULATIONS

MADE UNDER

THE GEORGETOWN ELECTRIC SUPPLY (CONTROL) ORDINANCE, 1959, (No. 13 of 1959)

UNDER SECTION 5 OF THE GEORGETOWN ELECTRIC SUPPLY (CON-TROL) ORDINANCE, 1959, THE FOLLOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE CONTROLLER OF ELECTRICITY WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE GOVERNOR-IN-COUNCIL :---

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Georgetown Electric Supply (Control) Regulations, 1959.

2. Subject to the provisions of regulations 3 and 4 of these Regulations, the Company shall not discontinue the supply of electricity to any person required to be supplied with electricity under the Order, or to any part of the area.

3. Upon a direction of the Controller in writing being given in that behalf to the person charged by the Company with the management of its undertaking, the Company shall discontinue the supply of electricity to such person or part of the area, and for such period, as may be specified in the direction and shall restore such supply upon the expiration of the said period, unless the same is sooner restored under the provisions of regulation 5 of these Regulations.

4. (1) The Controller may, by notice served upon the Company, prescribe the times at which the supply of electricity to any part of the area shall, subject to such conditions or exceptions as may be specified in the notice, be discontinued and restored by the Company, and may vary or revoke any such notice by subsequent notice served upon the Company.

(2) Subject to the provisions of any direction to the contrary given under regulations 3 or 5 of these Regulations, the Company shall not supply any electricity in contravention of the provisions of any notice served upon the Company under paragraph (1) of this regulation, and shall, in accordance with the provisions of the relevant notice served as aforesaid, restore every supply of electricity discontinued in compliance with any such notice.

5. Upon the receipt by the person charged as aforesaid of a direction of the Controller in writing in that behalf, the Company shall restore the supply of electricity to such person or part of the area as may be specified in the direction, although such supply may not then be restorable under the provisions of any notice or other direction served or given under these Regulations.

6. The Company shall, on summary conviction for the breach of any of these Regulations, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five hundred dollars.
