Made Under

THE GUYANA RICE BOARD ACT

(Cap. 72:01)

UNDER SECTION 43 OF THE GUYANA RICE BOARD ACT THE FOL-LOWING REGULATIONS HAVE BEEN MADE BY THE GUYANA RICE BOARD WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE PRESIDENT.

- 1. These regulations may be cited as the Rice Milling $^{\text{Citation.}}$ fees Regulations 1984.
 - 2. a) The fees which a manufacturer may charge for any Milling Fees. operation in the process of milling of padi into white rice are set out in the second column of Part A of the Schedule in relation to the operation mentioned in the first column of that Part.
 - b) The fees which a manufacturer may charge for any operation in the process of milling of padi into parboiled rice are set out in the second column of Part B of the Schedule in relation to the operation mentioned in the first column of that Part.
 - 3. A rice farmer may undertake by himself or at his Rice Farmer expense any Operation (excluding actual milling) in those operations of milling of padi (produced by him) into rice and he shall pay a manufacturer the fees for manufacturer at the rates fixed therefor by regulation 2.
 - 4. Any person who contravenes these regulations is Penalty liable on summary conviction to a fine of three hundred dollars or to imprisonment for three months.
