RESOLUTION No. XIX.

Whereas Kitty Ann Cooke, an indigent and aged resident of the West Coast, Demerara, sustained the loss of a sum of money forwarded to her by Money Order No. 14144, which was enclosed in a postal packet addressed to her, through the negligent misconduct of a letter-carrier in delivering the said packet to the wrong person at the wrong address;

AND WHEREAS the said Money Order has been paid to another person on a forged signature of the said addressee and the wrong-doer has been convicted and punished for the said forgery:

Be it Resolved,—That this Council is of opinion that the said loss should not fall on the payee of the said Money Order and respectfully recommends to His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government the payment to the said Kitty Ann Cooke of the said sum of money out of the public funds of the Colony.
